SELF-ISOLATION PAYMENT SCHEME 28/9 - 31/1/21

Somerset West & Taunton Council is working to ensure that people are not out of pocket if they are told to self-isolate and cannot work from home. The council is to administer the Government's Test and Trace Support Payment Scheme where eligible residents can claim self-isolation payments of £500.The legal duty to self-isolate came into force on 28 September for people who test positive for Covid-19 or are contacted by NHS Test and Trace app and are required to self-isolate. Applications must be made within 14 days of the end of your self-isolation period. For more information on eligibility and how to apply go to:

November 2020 Village Agent News:

The winter flu vaccination programme is in full swing – This year the flu vaccine is being offered on the NHS to adults 65 and over. People with certain medical conditions (including children in at-risk groups from 6 months of age). Pregnant women. People living with someone who's at high risk from coronavirus (on the NHS shielded patient list). Children aged 2 and 3 on 31 August 2020, children in primary school & year 7 pupils. Frontline health or social care workers.

All Flu Sessions for West Somerset Healthcare will be held at the Watchet Surgery this year. There is a one way system and 2m social distancing whilst patients wait. There will be temperature and symptom checks on arrival. GP's are on site but only for telephone and video consultations.

Poorly patients who need to be seen are asked to attend at Williton surgery. You may also be able to have your NHS flu vaccine at: your GP surgery, local Hospital or pharmacy or your midwifery service. Somerset CCG are also looking at one-stop shop type locations where people can get Covid testing, flu vaccinations, Covid vaccinations & anti-body testing. Full details are here:

West Somerset's Covid-19 infection rate is currently one of the highest in the county. Please help stop the spread of the virus in West Somerset www.bit.ly/2GSDitd. If you are feeling unwell, however mild - isolate and get a test, close contacts and household members must also isolate while awaiting the test result. You are putting yourself and other people at risk. Coronavirus affects people differently - you might have mild symptoms, but others can become seriously unwell. Think of loved ones and be vigilant. Socialise safely. Stick to the rules. Treat everyone as if they have the virus. Please act responsibly and remember: wash your hands, cover your face, make space.

ONLY get a test for a person displaying symptoms visit www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test or call 119 and keep isolated. If you can't get a test straight away or at a location near to you please keep trying. The whole household MUST self-isolate while waiting the test result. Even if the result is negative you must complete the 14 day isolation period. Inform workplace/school immediately about test result. The individual who has tested positive MUST self-isolate for at least 10 days from when symptoms* started (or from day of test). Other household members MUST NOT attend school or the workplace, the whole household must self-isolate for 14 days from day when symptoms* started (or from day of test if no symptoms) - EVEN if someone else tests negative during those 14 days you must Self-isolate for 14 days (as advised by NHS Test and Trace) The rest of your household does not need to self-isolate, unless they are a 'close contact' too . You only need to get a test if you develop symptoms. Even if you test negative during those 14 days you must still self-isolate for the full 14 days. Others in the household ONLY need to isolate if they also travelled with you. People with no symptoms should NOT get tested, even if they are a 'close contact' of someone who tests positive. (The only exception to this is if you are part of a special group) It's vital everyone acts to reduce their own risk, and the risk to others, from getting ill with coronavirus.
