MUSGROVE PARK HOSPITAL

New dedicated eye theatre suite opens to patients at Musgrove Park Hospital.

The new state-of-the-art suite is the first part in the development of a new eye care unit at the hospital, with a second theatre expected to be in operation at the suite in the autumn.

The development is one part of Musgrove 2030 – an ambitious programme to transform the hospital's facilities and ensure people are cared for in the right place to meet their health needs.

"Our eye unit is the busiest department at Musgrove Park Hospital, carrying out over 3,000 operations every year and providing nearly 50,000 outpatient appointments.

PARK AND RIDE FOR FREE from both P&R car parks whilst the Toneway Creech Castle is ongoing THE CREECH CASTLE ROAD SCHEME

The scheme at Creech Castle includes road widening and requires very significant works and activities. It is necessary to close Bridgwater Road north of the junction. This will affect vehicles but not pedestrians or cyclists who will have access throughout.

There will also be a permanent no right turn into Bridgwater Road south of the junction. It requires the A38 Bridgwater Road on the north side of the junction to be closed to all traffic for the duration of the works and a diversion will be in place using the new Western Relief Road.

Residents and businesses and those wishing to access the supermarket and other premises will continue to have access to the A38 although this will need to be from the north. Those accessing premises south of the railway bridge such as the Creech Castle Business Centre, including the Taunton Dialysis Centre, will need to do so from Toneway.
